Exodus 32:7-14

Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" The LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of

you I will make a great nation." But Moses implored the LORD his God, and said, "O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth?' Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, 'I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it forever.'" 

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CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- Share about a time when you lost something. What did you do?
- Talk about a time when you were lost. How did it feel not knowing where to go?
- Read Luke 15:1-10. How do people get “lost” or wander away from God? How does God pursue us when we are lost?

DEVOTIONS



In the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin, neither the sheep nor the coin has the power to be found. A woman and a shepherd actively search out that which is lost. Repentance is often understood as our human act that says, “Next time I will try harder.” In Luke the emphasis is on God who befriends “sinners and tax collectors,” those who are lost (Luke 15:1-10). Biblical repentance acknowledges that we are lost and need a savior to find us. It says, “You are kind, God! Please have pity on me. You are always merciful! Please wipe away my sins” (Psalm 51:1). Reflect on ways you feel lost in your relationship to people and to God. For each thought say aloud, “**Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me**” Psalm 51:10). End with the Lord’s Prayer.

SERVICE



Take a large garbage bag and go for a neighborhood walk. Collect as many “lost” or discarded items as you can find.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Hide real or chocolate coins in your house and play a good old-fashioned game of “hide and seek.” If you use real coins, spend what you find on a treat for the household. Talk about how God rejoices when people who are lost from him return.

Work together on completing a puzzle. As you do, talk about how each piece in the puzzle is needed and has a special place. And, how, in a similar way, each one of us is valuable to God and is sought out by God. Share about the special qualities you see in one another.
